The Derbyshire Council had been unaware how close the Arboretum was to Catton Hall and it was designated a 'Sensitive Receptor'. That meant that the decibel levels would have to be reduced and will have an effect on the 'Bloodstock' event. The Clerk will contact the Arboretum and ask if they had complained.
